

Jalandhar DC bans courier sale of methanol to curb misuse

Jalandhar: In a decisive move to prevent the misuse of hazardous chemicals, Deputy Commissioner Dr. Himanshu Aggarwal has imposed a strict ban on the sale and delivery of Methyl Alcohol (Methanol) through courier services in Jalandhar district. The directive comes in the wake of growing concerns over the illicit trade and potential misuse of this poisonous substance.

During a review meeting, the DC instructed all Sub Divisional Magistrates (SDMs) to closely monitor and regulate the sale and distribution of Methanol within their respective jurisdictions. He emphasized the importance of preventing unauthorized and unlicensed sales of the chemical, particularly those operating under the guise of

courier services. The DC also highlighted the need to identify unlicensed traders dealing in Methanol, maintain a separate list of license holders with permission to stock and sell it, and ensure regular inspections of licensed firms. Monthly reports detailing the purchase, sale, and stock of Methanol are to be submitted to SDMs for strict monitoring, he noted.

The move is part of a broader strategy to control the illegal sale and misuse of toxic substances and to safeguard public health in the region.

Day 114 of 'Yudh Nashian Virudh' Fight against drugs in full swing

126 drug smugglers held with 5.3 kg heroin

Chandigarh: The Punjab Police on Monday arrested 126 drug smugglers and recovered 5.3 kg of heroin and 200 grams of opium during statewide operations as part of its ongoing anti-drug campaign 'Yudh Nashian Virudh', which has now completed 114 days.

According to official figures, the cumulative number of drug smugglers arrested during the campaign has now reached 18,843. The police also recovered Rs 8,850 in drug-related cash during Monday's operations. The crackdown was carried out on the directions of Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav across all 28 police districts. The

drive, aimed at eradicating the drug menace from the state, is being conducted under the direct supervision of the Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann, who has directed district and police officials to intensify efforts toward making Punjab a drug-free state.

To ensure better oversight, the state government has formed a five-member Cabinet Sub-Committee headed by Finance Minister Harpal Singh Cheema to monitor the campaign's progress and coordination.

Providing further details of the latest operation, Special DGP (Law and Order) Arpit Shukla said that over 200 police teams involving more than 1,500 personnel were deployed under the supervision of 99 gazetted



officers. The teams conducted simultaneous raids at 506 locations across Punjab and registered 85 first information reports (FIRs) in one day. Additionally, police personnel questioned 540 individuals identified as suspicious during the statewide operation.

As part of the state's three-pronged strategy of Enforcement, De-addiction, and Prevention (EDP), the Special DGP said police teams also focused on rehabilitation efforts.

On Monday alone, 47 individuals were persuaded to undergo treatment for addiction and join de-addiction and rehabilitation programs.

The Punjab government has reiterated that the war on drugs will continue with full force and sustained coordination between enforcement and public health agencies.

Man arrested with 65 narcotic pills

Dhuri: The local police on Sunday arrested a man in possession of narcotic pills during a routine patrol near village Khedi Jatanki. The accused has been identified as Nahar Singh, a resident of village Mimsa.

According to ASI Narinder Singh, he was conducting a patrol with his team from Mimsa to Khedi Jatanki via a dirt road when they spotted a suspicious person. On seeing the police, the man attempted to flee, raising further suspicion.

The police team quickly chased and apprehended the individual. During the arrest, the accused tried to discard a transparent envelope he was carrying. Upon inspection, the envelope was found to contain 65 narcotic pills that were not in blister packs (loose tablets). The police

immediately took Nahar Singh into custody and seized the recovered pills. A case has been registered against him under relevant sections of the NDPS Act. The accused will be produced in court, and further investigation is underway to trace the source of the narcotics and whether others are involved in the supply chain. Police officials reiterated their commitment to intensifying surveillance in rural areas to curb the spread of drugs.

Fire breaks out at Punjab-Haryana HC Major property loss reported

Chandigarh: A massive fire broke out on Monday morning at the Punjab and Haryana High Court complex in Chandigarh, triggering panic among staff and lawyers and causing significant damage to property. While no casualties have been reported, officials estimate the loss at approximately Rs 35 lakh.

According to sources, the fire started around 9:00 am and rapidly engulfed the Ladies Bar Room and Room No. 4. A portion of the main Bar Room also suffered extensive damage. The blaze caused the destruction of several important documents, electronic equipment, and furniture. Multiple fire tenders were immediately rushed to the scene after the fire alarm was raised. Firefighting

operations continued for over an hour before the flames could be brought under control. Firefighters, police, and court officials worked together to evacuate parts of the building and ensure safety.

Fortunately, as the court had not yet started its daily proceedings and only a few staff members were present in the affected sections, there were no injuries or fatalities reported. However, the scale of property damage was described as "severe." A statement issued by the High Court Bar Association confirmed that the fire had completely gutted the Ladies Bar Room and Room No. 4. In addition to physical infrastructure, several case files, legal records, computers, and bar association documents are believed to have been lost in the fire. The exact cause of the blaze remains unknown. Preliminary investigations by

the fire department and court administration have been launched, and officials have not ruled out the possibility of an electrical short circuit. However, a formal report is awaited. The High Court administration has also ordered an internal inquiry to determine the extent of the damage and evaluate lapses in fire safety protocols. Steps are also being planned to prevent such incidents in the future, including the installation of additional fire detection and suppression systems. Senior advocates and members of the Bar have expressed concern over the loss of key infrastructure and records and have urged the administration to expedite repair and restoration work. Court operations continued with some delay, but functioning in affected rooms remains suspended until further notice.

Misbehaviour with BSF women jawans

Ferozepur: A serious incident has come to light in the border area of Mamdot in Ferozepur district, where Border Security Force (BSF) personnel, including women staff, were reportedly misbehaved with by local individuals near the Gatti Hayat BSF Border Outpost (BOP). According to the complaint filed by Inspector Z. Ngouri, Company Commander of the 155 Battalion 'E' Company of BSF, on June 20, a group of men were consuming alcohol near the BSF checkpoint gate while operating their field motor pump. When BSF personnel, including female staff, intervened and asked them to stop, the accused allegedly hurled abuses at them. Shockingly, they also attempted to undress in front of the women personnel, causing further outrage. Based on the complaint, the Mamdot police registered a case on June 22 against three accused — Jarnail Singh, Harjinder Singh, and Dilbagh Singh, all residents of Chak Bhange Wala village.

VB arrests block Samiti Patwari taking Rs 20,000 bribe

Chandigarh: The Punjab Vigilance Bureau (VB), during its ongoing drive against corruption, has arrested Nishan Singh, block Samiti Patwari, posted at Block Development and Panchayats Officer (BDPO) office, Gurdaspur for demanding and accepting a bribe of Rs. 20,000.

Disclosing this here on Monday an official spokesperson of the state VB said the arrest has been made following a complaint lodged by a resident of village Babari Nangal, in Gurdaspur.

The complainant has approached the VB and stated that she is the current Panchayat member of Gram Panchayat Babri Nangal and her husband had been cultivating about 22 kanals and 11 marlas of shamlat land out of total 25 acres of land for the last 50 years and the land title (Girdawari) of this land is

also registered in his name. She further stated that on the basis of a complaint, the BDPO office had asked her to submit a clarification in this regard. She requested the current Sarpanch of her village to resolve this issue but the said Nishan Singh Samiti Patwari has demanded a bribe of Rs. 20,000 to get

the issue resolved through his department. The spokesperson informed that after a preliminary verification of this complaint, the VB team laid a trap during which the accused Nishan Singh has been arrested red handed while he was accepting a bribe Rs 20,000 from the complainant in presence

of two official witnesses. In this regard a case under prevention of corruption act has been registered against the accused at VB police station Amritsar range. The accused would be produced in the competent court tomorrow and further investigation is underway, he said.

Cabinet reshuffle likely in Pb CM Mann seeks time from Governor

Chandigarh: A reshuffle in the Punjab Cabinet is expected imminently, with Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann reportedly seeking time from Governor Gulab Chand Kataria. Sources indicate that the reshuffle could take place as early as Tuesday.

The development follows the by-election victory of Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) candidate and Rajya Sabha MP Sanjeev Arora, who won the Ludhiana West Assembly seat by a significant margin. During the campaign, both Chief Minister Mann and AAP National Convener Arvind Kejriwal had publicly announced that Arora would be made a minister if he won. With the victory now secured, the stage appears set for his induction into the state cabinet. The Punjab Cabinet currently has two vacant berths, and Arora is expected to fill one of them. Sources suggest

that another new face might be inducted to fill the second vacancy. While no official list of potential appointees has been released, there is speculation that some existing ministers may be dropped to make way for fresh entrants.

Arora's elevation would mark his first entry into the Punjab Legislative Assembly, and his induction is seen as a reward for his decisive win in Ludhiana West. Though the party has maintained official silence on the reshuffle, sources close to the government say discussions have been underway for several weeks regarding possible changes in the Cabinet. The leadership reportedly aims to balance regional representation and performance in the reshuffle. Governor's office has yet to confirm anything, but preparations are understood to be in motion.
